

Secondary activities is the processing (manufacturing/transforming) of raw materials into products or goods.

Promotes development of the primary activities as raw materials are needed.




 Tertiary activities impacted positively e.g. improvement in transport infrastructure, commercial institutions like banks.





- Growth in quaternary activities e.g. research for development of more effectively with Dave machinery.
- Supply finished products reducing imports, creating a positive impact on balance of trade.


Exporting of finished products earns South Africa more money than exporting raw material.
