If you are given one country check the list below and choose a country not chosen in the Africa Map attached. This is in preparation for Pan African Parliament (PAP) debate in 9 below.

### **5 PARTICIPATION RULES FOR PUBLIC SPEAKING**

- 1) One topic per district (as indicated below)
- 2) 8 minutes per learner
- 3) Language of presentation: Any of the official languages
- 4) A copy of the speech to be handed over to panel prior to presentation

## Public Speaking (8 minutes)

The following SIX districts must prepare History learners for Public speaking under the following topics

- One country, many cultures( Focus-unity within diverse cultures) Cradock
- Entangled roots(reconciliation, anti-discrimination and anti-xenophobia) E.L. district
- Whose life is it anyway( risk behaviours of the youth including teenage pregnancy drug abuse etc)Mbizana
- Looking back, going forward(cultural and historical links between past and present) KWT
- My voice will be heard(democratic participation and patriotism) Uitenhage
- Schools reflect the values upheld by society(crime, violence and ill discipline at school) Lusikisiki

## 6 PARTICIPATION RULES FOR DEBATING

- 1) Topic
- 2) 3 learners per district
- 3) Parliamentary style based on the Pan African Parliament(PAP)
- 4) Time limit: as per the different sessions
- 5) Language of Presentation: English

## 7 SIMULATION

The kind of simulation that the learners will engage in is that of PAP. The participating teams represent themselves in a debate which modeled on the structure of PAP. Each team gives speeches explaining their policy on the issue at hand and reacting to the policies of other teams and then attempt to come to an agreement on the issues being debated.

It is crucial that each team/region understands the issue at hand in depth.
