SUBJECT: REOPENING OF SCHOOLS DURING COVID-19 RISK ADJUSTED ALERT LEVEL 4

1. PURPOSE

1.1 To give guidance on the re-opening of schools for the third quarter in line with the directions issued by the Minister of Basic Education dated 15 July 2021.

2 Introduction

Following the president's announcement that the country is to operate at COVID 19 Risk Adjusted Alert Leve 4, the Minister of Basic Education Issued Directions

3. REOPENING OF SCHOOLS

- 2.1 The following procedures should be observed in re-opening of schools for the third term:
 - i. Schools will reopen on 26 July 2021 for all grades utilizing the daily or weekly rotational timetable model.
 - All principals, SMT's and non-teaching staff to return to school on
 22 July 2021 to prepare for the return of learners to school on 26
 July 2021.

- iii. The rest of the educators must return to school on 26 July 2021
- iv. Principals, SMT's and non-teaching staff in primary schools (Grade R to Grade 7) and in schools for learners with special educational needs (Grade R to Grade 12) must utilize the weekly rotation timetable model commencing on 26 July 2021 to finalize the preparations for the return to the traditional daily attendance timetable model on 2 August 2021. This means that grades R to 7(mainstream) and grades R to 12 (schools with learners with special education needs) will use the normal traditional timetable from 02 August 2021.
- v. All catch-up programmes targeting grades 11 and 12 must continue as planned and school principals and district officials are called upon to monitor such programmes closely
