Commonwealth Scholarships

- Funded by the UK Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO)
- Enables talented and motivated scholars to gain the knowledge and skills required to make a positive impact on the development priorities of their home country
- Administered by the Commonwealth Scholarships Commission in the United Kingdom (CSC)
- Over 30,000 Commonwealth Scholars and Fellows awards since 1960



Commonwealth Scholarships

- PhD Scholarships (for least developed countries and fragile states)
- Split-site Scholarships (for low and middle-income countries)
- o Master's Scholarships
- Shared Master's Scholarships
- Distance Learning Scholarships
- Split-site PhD Scholarships (for high income countries)
- Professional Fellowships



Master's Scholarships

- For candidates from eligible lower and upper middle income
 Commonwealth countries
- Full-time taught Master's study at a UK university
- o Talented and motivated individuals from all backgrounds
- Encourages applications from individuals from historically disadvantaged backgrounds and people living with disabilities
- Note: CSC would not normally fund a second UK Master's degree and MBAs are not funded
- Offered under six <u>CSC Development themes</u>



CSC Development themes

- 1. Science and technology for development
- 2. Strengthening health systems and capacity
- 3. Promoting global prosperity
- 4. Strengthening global peace, security and governance
- 5. Strengthening resilience and response to crises
- 6. Access, inclusion and opportunity

Who can apply

SA Citizen/permanent resident in SA

Full time taught masters' programmes

Honours degree **NQF 8** level and meet minimum criteria for proposed course

Minimum of 65% average mark and above achieved

Candidates applying for study programme aligned to CSC theme and global & national priorities (Full time studies only)

Available to start in Sept 23 (start of UK academic year)



How to apply

DHET is one of the nominating agencies for South Africans

Applications strictly on the CSC's online application system

Supporting documents to be uploaded on the system by closing date **18 October 2022**

You need to **apply for admission to your preferred universities in advance** of your scholarship application. Select 3 universities and courses - resources available on the CSC website

CSC will not accept any applications <u>not</u> submitted via the online application system

NB: No additional application form to complete or submit to DHET



Supporting documents

- $\circ~$ Valid passport and national ID document
- Transcripts of all higher education qualifications (with certified translation)
- References from at least two individuals on a clear letterhead /email showing referee's details (applicants to upload references – referees will no longer receive a separate email)

NB:

Late documents will not be considered

Failure to submit above documents will result in disqualification of application



Selection criteria

Applications will be considered according to the following selection criteria:

- Academic merit of the candidate
- \circ Quality of the plan of study
- Potential impact on the development of the candidate's home country

Correct completion of the rest of the application form

What do we look at

Academic merit

Exam results / transcripts References (professional references)

Academic awards/ achievements (secondary)

Quality of study plan

Personal statement and relation to stated objectives

Extent of course and institution research

Clear presentation of study plan (practical and well thought of and constructed)

Development impact

How the study plan relates to the development of sector/home country objectives

Clear measurable outcomes, timeframes and intended beneficiaries

Clear demonstration of how acquired skills will be applied



What the scholarship covers

- $\circ~$ Approved airfare for awardees only
- \circ Tuition fees
- Living allowance of £1,235 per month (R25k), or £1566 per month (R31,6k) for those at universities in the London metropolitan area (rates quoted at current levels)
- Warm clothing allowance (where applicable)
- Study travel grant towards the cost of study-related travel within the UK or overseas
- Additional financial support if you declare a disability (full assessment will apply)
- Additional support for children if widowed, and or single parent (conditions apply)

Tips for applicants

Plan and prepare your application in advance, don't wait until the last minute Proofread your application and ask someone else to proofread again

Make sure to apply for admission to our preferred universities in advance

Demonstrate why you are the strongest candidate – highly competitive scholarship


Demonstrated a clear and realistic plan of study in your application Demonstrated how you would make tangible development impacts at the end of your award

Put a lot of effort into your development impact statement – follow the directions on the CSC website

Final nominations to the CSC



Post nomination

CSC will notify applicants via email about provisional selection (subject to the CSC agreeing your terms of admission to the university)

Formal offer of a scholarship once terms of admission confirmed

You will be required to sign an <u>undertaking to return to your</u> <u>home country</u> as soon as possible after your studies

Comply with all necessary requirements to take up the scholarship (immigration, code of conduct, etc.)

Awardees to be invited to a pre-departure briefing by the British Council
