SUBJECT: EXTENSION OF PRESIDENTIAL YOUTH EMPLOYMENT INITIATIVE

PHASE 4 CONTRACTS FOR EA'S AND GSA'S THAT ARE PLACED IN PRIORITY CATEGORIES AND SPECIAL SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

PROGRAMMES TO 31 DECEMBER 2023

DATE: 18 OCTOBER 2023

 Eastern Cape Department of Education implemented Presidential Youth Employment Initiative Phase 4 that came to an end on the 30th of September 2023, as guided by the framework.

2. Project Timeframes are guided by DBE and are applicable to all Provinces. The ECDoE project team has foreseen a challenge in ending PYEI Phase 4 contracts of EA's that are placed in crucial and critical areas in the middle of the 4th term. These EA's assist in the coordination and preparations for examinations.







- 3. In an effort to save the situation and reduce the negative impact which can be caused by the withdrawal of Educator Assistants in schools, Department of Basic Education (DBE) has requested all implementing Provinces to look for savings which were realised in the implementation of PYEI Phase 4 and extend EAs contracts up to 31st December 2023.
- 4. However, the sector cannot retain all youth appointed in PYEI Phase 4 due to budgetary constraints therefore, extensions of contracts will be implemented in priority areas.
- 5. With teaching and learning being the core business of the Department, Curriculum EA's will be prioritised for extension this decision is informed by the fact that the sector's overall performance is measured by output of grade 12 results and all other curriculum aligned performance indicators.
- It is, therefore, the sector's priority to ensure stability in schools to achieve the best possible results.
- Implementation of the PYEI Phase 4 contract extension will start with all FET Phase Curriculum EAs to ensure stability in the FET Phase and to provide support during examinations.
- 8. The extension will then be followed by all curriculum EAs in the GET phase, unemployed educators, youth living with disabilities and reading champions EA's registered for the ECD qualification.
- 9. A staggered approach will be followed in the extension of contracts as follows:

- **10.** All Districts and participating schools are urged to strictly adhere to the set extension dates and categories to be extended.
- 11. Districts are requested to submit and declare all categories of EA's who are due to be extended as per the criteria that is set above.
- 12. The following criteria must be implemented across all Districts when Implementing the extension.
 - The participant must produce certificates of all compulsory trainings that were completed during phase 4.
 - Ages between 18 35
 - Curriculumn EA
 - All other requirements for appointment are applicable as guided by the framework.
- 13. An approval for implementation will only be given to districts who have submitted their complete databases as per prescribed templates.
- 14. The extension will be implemented through registration of a special SCC, schools are not to replace assistants but continue with those already in the system as at 30 September 2023
- 15. Districts are to manage this extension in a coordinated manner and strictly adhere to guidelines provided.
- 16. The Department values your continued support in ensuring that the implementation of PYEI is a success.
