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ZANDY'S JOURNEY TO COMPLETING THE TWO OCEANS MARATHON

Zandile Makitiwana, affectionately known as Zandy, is a shining example of a woman who excels in multiple roles with remarkable prowess. As an Administrative Clerk in the IT & Certification Unit under the Assessments and Examinations Office, Zandy juggles her professional responsibilities with fitness. But there's another side to Zandy, she's a passionate and accomplished runner who embodies determination and strength.

By day, Zandy is a dedicated professional contributing to her team; by dawn, she's a force of nature on the running trails, pushing her limits and crushing her goals as a proud member of the Buffalo Runners Athletic Club (BRAC) eQonce. Her impressive accomplishments in ultramarathons have earned her recognition in the running community. Notably, Zandy has completed the challenging Two Oceans Marathon (56km) an impressive four times in a row from 2022 to 2025 – a testament to her endurance, strength and mental toughness.

Zandy's athletic journey began in her school days with excellence in short-distance events like 100m and 200m sprints and relay races. Her transition to long-distance running, sparked by joining a running club, has been a pathway to discovering her true passion. According to Zandy, her success stems from building a solid foundation of endurance, strength and mental resilience, guided by a structured training plan crafted with her coaches.

For Zandy, running transcends physical challenge "Running helps me manage stress, teaches perseverance and gives me a sense of accomplishment. It fuels my personal growth, tests my limits, courage and will", said Zandy.

Zandy's path hasn't been without hurdles. In 2022, she faced severe cramping during the Two Oceans Marathon but with support from fellow runners, she adjusted her stride and finished the race. Running has taught her invaluable skills like goal-setting, discipline and recovery. "Running has humbled me and shown me the importance of respecting the process. It teaches me to celebrate achievements and never give up", she added.

As an inspiration to the youth, especially women juggling multiple roles, Zandy advises starting slow and setting achievable goals. "Celebrate your progress and love what you're doing. Consistency is key, even if it's just a few minutes a day", encourages Zandy.

Support from her family, colleagues and friends has been pivotal. "My nephew, son, and colleagues believes in me, tracking my progress and sending congratulatory messages after each race", said Zandy with gratitude.

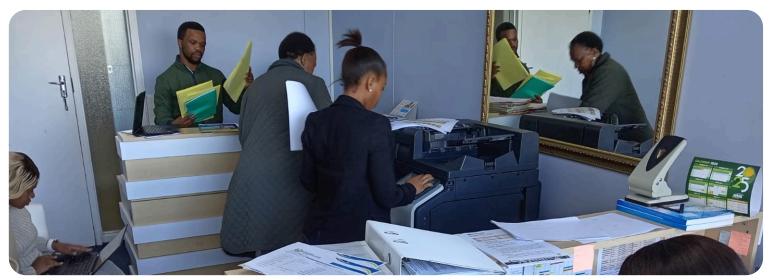

ECDOE ENCOURAGES STAFF TO GUARD AGAINST FLU

Education's Wellness Services Unit urges ECDOE staff to protect themselves against respiratory infections associated with winter season by taking preventative measures such as getting flu vaccines.

Assistant Director, Wellness Services Bongiwe Godloza stated that last month the Department collaborated with trained pharmacists to administer the vaccination of employees at its Head Office.

"The primary aim of the vaccination was to help minimize the number of employees who are absent due to flu infections. Additionally, these infection can easily spread from one person to the other in the workplace. We believe that by proactively addressing these issues, we will help maintain a healthier work environment for everyone," said Godloza.

Additionally, Godloza encourages employees who did not take part on the day of the vaccination to go to the nearest clinics, pharmacies and private Doctors to get vaccinated. School health Social-Worker, Yolanda Blankethe, highlighted valuable insight about the flu vaccination and its benefits. "The vaccine is a 'prescribed injection designed to prevent illnesses associated with the winter season,' a time when many people tend to get sick."

"Individuals with underlying health conditions can greatly benefit from this vaccination. It also saves our colleagues much time because instead of waiting in line at hospitals and clinics, they can use that time to focus on their health and well-being," said Blankethe.

Labour Relations Officer Zukile Dibiya believes that getting the flu vaccination is vital, since COVID-19 still lurks around.

"I believe that prevention is better than cure, especially for your loved ones. Getting vaccinated reduces the chances of getting flue and spreading it at work." concluded Dibiya
