- Use a variety of teaching strategies and technologies to meet the needs of diverse learners.
- Provide timely and constructive feedback on student progress, and use this feedback to inform instruction.
- Collaborate with colleagues and parents to promote student success and well-being.
- Continuously reflect on and evaluate teaching practices, and seek out opportunities for professional growth and development.
- Establish routines and procedures that promote efficiency and maximize instructional time.
- Use positive reinforcement to recognize and celebrate student accomplishments and positive behaviours.
- Provide opportunities for learners to develop leadership skills and take on roles of responsibility in the classroom.
- Maintain a sense of humour and positive outlook, even in the face of challenges and setbacks.
- Foster a lifelong love of learning by promoting curiosity, creativity, and intellectual risk-taking.

In conclusion, teachers who embrace their role as classroom leaders can make a significant impact on student learning and well-being. By fostering a culture of respect, responsibility, and continuous growth, teachers can inspire and empower their students to achieve their full potential.

Mandela Day Coding Tournaments

I am happy to introduce you to the Mandela Day tournaments taking place across South Africa, as well as the rest of Africa, on 18 July 2023.

The bigger Tangible Africa project started in 2017 when a postgraduate student at Nelson Mandela University, Byron Batteson, developed the <u>TANKS</u> coding app. The purpose of the app has been from the start to introduce learners to coding concepts without the use of computers. The desperate shortage of software developers combined with the challenge of 1000's of schools who do not have computer laboratories, makes this project very relevant in South Africa.

Since 2017 the project, a collaboration between Nelson Mandela University and Leva Foundation, has reached nearly 100 000 learners, with coding kits being distributed to over 500 schools. The project is now also reaching out to the rest of Africa, with an initial footprint in Tanzania, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Uganda, Kenya, Ghana, and Namibia.

Since July 2018 we have been presenting <u>coding tournaments</u> on Mandela Day, in various formats. Last year saw over 6000 learners participate at 50 sites across South Africa as well as in a few other African countries.

We are looking forward to as many as possible cities, townships and rural villages hosting tournaments.

The basic format of a tournament is as follows:

- Teams participate with 5 learners per team.
- The most general categories are Grades 6 and 7, and Grades 8 and 9.
- A tournament can have a minimum of 4 teams participating, with no maximum limit set.
- Participants are typically given 30-40 minutes to see how many levels of either TANKS or RANGERS they can complete. The team that has completed the most levels win.
- As sponsorships allow, Tangible Africa will provide funds to each site, mainly for incentives. Where critically needed, we will do our best to assist with other logistical costs.
- We also plan to provide some game packs beforehand for learners to practice with.
